PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION.

"Improvements in and relating to Fountain and Stylographic Pens".

I, CECIL BRISTOW, of 29, Cranston Road, Forest Hill, in the County of London, Clerk, do hereby declare the nature of this invention to be as follows:—

This invention relates to fountain and stylographic pens and has for its object to provide a pen which can lie comfortably in the waistcoat pocket and which 5 is adapted to be lengthened for use.

In a fountain or stylographic pen made in accordance with this invention the reservoir is completely covered by a cap or tubular part which gives the utmost protection to all parts against breakage and which is adapted to form the extension of the holder.

Figs. 1 and 2 are sectional elevation of a stylographic pen made in accordance with this invention.

a is a cap adapted to cover the reservoir part b as shewn in Fig. 2 and to form an extension to the pen as shewn in Fig. 1.

COMPLETE SPECIFICATION.

"Improvements in and relating to Fountain and Stylographic Pens"

20 I, Cecil Bristow, of 29 Cranston Road, Forest Hill in the County of London, Clerk, do hereby declare the nature of this invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, to be particularly described and ascertained in and by the following statement:—

This invention relates to fountain and stylographic pens of the kind having a cap which completely covers and protects the reservoir when the pen is not in use and is adapted to form an extension to the pen rendering it of requisite length for writing purposes, such pens being provided at the rear end with two contact surfaces of equal diameter separated by a raised portion adapted to serve as an abutment for the cap both when the pen is covered and when extended for use.

The invention has for object to provide a pen of such construction that it can lie comfortably in the waistcoat pocket and in which the cap may be placed so as to cover the body portion without risk of jamming thereon.

In the drawings accompanying my Provisional Specification: -

Figs. 1 and 2 are sectional elevations of a stylographic pen made in accordance with this invention.

a is the cap which is of substantially the same length as the body portion b of the pen and is adapted to completely cover the reservoir; c is a collar; d is

a raised contact surface at the front side of the collar e and e is a second surface of equal diameter at the rear side of said collar.

Having now particularly described and ascertained the nature of my said invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, I declare that what I claim is;—

The improved reservoir pen comprising the combination of a body portion provided at its rear end with a raised contact surface on one side of a collar and with a second contact surface of equal diameter at the other side of said collar, with a cap of substantially the same length as said body portion, said contact surfaces being respectively adapted to receive the cap when the pen is covered 10 and when it is extended for writing purposes.



