

DESIGN FOR A WRITING PEN

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Harold E. Steinberg, a citizen of the United States of America and a resident of the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented the new, original, and ornamental Design for a Writing Pen, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof, in which:

Fig. 1 is a plan view of a wiring pen showing my new design.

Fig. 2 is a side elevational view of the writing pen.

Fig. 3 is the front elevational view of the writing pen.

Fig. 4 is the rear elevational view of the writing pen.

Fig. 5 is a sectional view on the line V—V, Fig. 2.

Fig. 6 is a sectional view on the line VI—VI, Fig. 2.

Fig. 7 is a sectional view on the line VII—VII, Fig. 2.

Fig. 8 is a sectional view on the line VIII—VIII, Fig. 2.

Fig. 9 is a sectional view on the line IX—IX, Fig. 2.

The salient features of my new design for a writing pen reside in the character of the taper of body from point to shank; the latter being substantially straight, and the relatively flat sides which blend into the curved upper portion of the body; such sides sloping outwardly from such curved upper surface and rearwardly to the shouldered portion at its junction with the shank.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a writing pen, as shown and described.
