



To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Clark Gower, a citizen of the United States, residing at Nashville, in the county of Davidson and State of Tennessee, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Celluloid Bullet Pencil, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

Fig. 1 is a side view of a Celluloid bullet pencil, in a closed position; $\$

Fig. 2 is a side elevational view of the same in an open or writing position;

Fig. 3 is a longitudinal sectional view of the barrel and of the eraser, and

Fig. 4 is an end view from the left of the disclosure in Fig. 1, showing my new design.
