DESIGN FOR A FOUNTAIN PEN

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Victor H. Severy, a citizen of the United States, residing at Atlanta, in the county of Fulton and State of Georgia, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Fountain Pen, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a front elevational view of a fountain pen showing my new design.

Figures 2, 3 and 4 are side, front and rear views respectively with the cap omitted.

The lined panels of the writing end of the barrel are areas presenting a dead effect caused by very fine lines. The strips between these areas are polished surfaces. The dead surfaces are in a substantially conical surface concentric with the surface in which the bright strips lie and are sunk very slightly below the surface of the bright strips.
